TRAVEL TIPS by Dick Hurley

DON'T LEAVE HOME WITHOUT IT!

On a trip outside the USA, your most important possession is not money, credit cards or luggage. It is your passport. Without it, you will not be allowed to exit a foreign country or to return through any US port, airport or border crossing. If you have lost your passport, you must interrupt your trip and get to the nearest US. Embassy or Consulate as soon as possible to get a temporary passport issued. When you arrive at the embassy or consulate you must first be able to prove who you say you are. The best way to verify your identity is to show a photocopy of the inside pages of your passport that shows your name, address and a picture. Get a photo copy made of these two pages and carry it with you, in a place separate from where you carry your passport. A driver's license or other Identification card can also be helpful. Prior to this year, passports were not required for entering or re-entry from such bordering countries as Mexico and Canada. Now a US passport or similar travel document is required from all foreign countries.
