He expanded his banking business in 1890 to San Francisco and built a Victorian mansion on the corner of Franklin and Sacramento streets. But he and his family moved to a luxury hotel in San Rafael for June, July and August, to escape the cold summers of San Francisco. Isaias, and many of his contemporaries, would take the ferry to San Francisco for work, dressed for the cool weather in his wool suit and waistcoat, then return to the sunshine of Marin County at the end of the day.

If you are taking a vacation to somewhere sunny this summer, have a great time. We'll miss you and the rest of us will try to keep our tables full and our activities active by inviting friends to join us. If you are sticking around, how about bringing one of your friends to the next meeting, as a prospective new member?

Alex and Penny Koliopoulos recently celebrated their 60th Anniversary. Penny was born and grew up in San Francisco, Alex was born in Hanford, California and moved to San Francisco. Both were graduates of Commerce High School. Penny retired from AAA,

where she was a claims adjuster. Alex retired from the Teamsters. They have 2 children and a granddaughter. Alex joined the Air Force in 1941. He went to flight school, and became a radioman and top turret gunner in a B-24 Liberator Bomber. He was with the 376th Bomber Group, 515th Squadron, known as Satan's Kids, and flew 19 combat missions in Europe. On one of the flights over Austria his ship was heavily damaged by anti aircraft fire. They were able to fly back to allied territory, but had to crash land. Not everyone in the plane made it out alive. Alex received a head and leg injury. When he recovered and was able, he flew two more combat missions. Eventually he was transferred stateside for training in a B-29. When the war ended, he was discharged.
