Have a Complaint, see the Captain!

In the early days of sailing, on the masted ships, to be part of the crew could be hazardous to your health. At sea the captain's word was law. If the captain was a tyrant and scurrilous, your voyage could be very interesting. You not only had to make the captain happy, you had to fit in good with the mates and crew or you were in trouble, and you better know how to reeve a Spanish Burton. Some of the hazards were terrible food, miserable living conditions, brutal discipline, scurvy, flogging, and the possibility of dying. A favorite saying among the sailors was, "God made the vittles, but the devil made the cook." When in port, provisions were generally good, fresh meat, produce, water, etc. When at sea, and the provisions were scarce, the average meal was a piece of salt pork or salt beef, a hard tack biscuit and a cup of hot water with molasses. On Sundays the crew was served Duff (Duff Pudding), which was boiled flour with molasses. If the captain wanted to get on the good side of the crew, Duff was served twice a week. If conditions were so bad and you overtook the captain, it was mutiny. If you seized the ship, it was Piracy. Both offenses led to hanging. You could always jump ship, but there could be a price on your head. Of course, if you had a complaint, you could complain to the captain (possible flogging). Good Luck!
