Toward the end of May there are two ceremonies that we all should consider attending. The 2013 Annual Memorial Day Ceremony at the USS San Francisco Monument and Memorial will begin at noon on Sunday, May 26 at USS San Francisco Memorial Park just north of the intersection of 48th and Point Lobos. The program usually lasts an hour or so and will include a talk on the history of a warship named for the city, which, though sorely wounded, emerged triumphantly from the battle Guadalcanal, November 12-13, 1942, after inflicting heavy losses on the enemy. In addition, there will be the reading of the names of those lost in the battle. The program will honor a veteran of the battle and there updates on the status of the foundation supporting the memory of the ship. The Memorial Day Commemoration is the next day on Monday, May 27. The San Francisco National Cemetery is the backdrop for one of the largest commemorations in the state of California, typically attended by nearly 2,000 people. The ceremony is sponsored by the Mayor's Memorial Day Citizen's Committee, with support from the Presidio Trust and other partners. The parade begins in the Main Post at 10:30 am and proceeds to the cemetery. The ceremony begins at 11 am at San Francisco National Cemetery. Join veterans and the community for the traditional,

Memorial Day Commemoration, at the **Presidio**. There will be a band present to play the songs of each of the services.
