Macdonough of the Navy "The battle of Plattsburgh (War of 1812) was the most important engagement of the war." Winston Churchill

Thomas Macdonough grew up on a farm in Delaware. He was the son of Dr. Thomas and Mary Macdonough. His father had been a major during the War of Independence. Young Thomas became a midshipman at 16 years of age. His first tour of duty under Captain John Mullowny was sailing to the Caribbean where they captured 3 French merchant vessels. He later sailed under the command of Lt. Stephen Decatur, sailing to the Barbary Coast in North Africa, to ward off pirates. At age 20 Thomas led a boarding party killing the captain and 20 members of his crew, and capturing the ship. When, the frigate Philadelphia had run aground near Tripoli, and was captured by the Tripolitans., concerned that the Philadelphia would be used for piracy, a plan was formed to rescue the ship or destroy it. Macdonough, being familiar with the ship volunteered for the raid. Unable to save the ship, it was set on fire. The raid proved to be a stunning success. Thomas proved himself to be a natural born leader. One who cared deeply about his men, and had their unreserved respect, and he was deeply religious.

Macdonough served in many capacities. His first command was the sloop of war, USS Wasp. He was later promoted to Master Commandant in charge of shipbuilding at Otter Creek Vt., in order to regain the lake.

Macdonough was put in charge of defending Lake Champlain. On September 11, 1814 the main battle began. The British had 16 ships, 100 men and 90 long range cannons. The Americans had 14 ships, 800 men and 86 guns, mostly short range cannons. The British army started a coordinated land attack at the same time. Macdonough in a stroke of brilliance connected most of his ships by nets and cables. Using anchors to maneuver the ships without being at the mercy of the wind, the ships were able to concentrate their firepower. The engagement lasted 2 hours and 20 minutes, and when it was over the British struck their colors. The Americans had won the day, Macdonough believed in the rigorous training of his men, and this training was the key to victory. When the British army saw the colors were struck, knowing they would not be supplied by the sea, they retreated. The battle to this day is studied in many military colleges around the world.

Thomas Macdonough, A true American Hero!


