agricultural techniques in the United States and served as President Cleveland's Secretary of Agriculture. He set the example by planting orchards, shade trees, and wind breaks on his own farm, and urged his neighbors to follow suit. His real opportunity came when he became a member of Nebraska's state Board of Agriculture. He proposed that a special day be set aside dedicated to tree planting and increasing awareness of the importance of trees. Nebraska's first Arbor Day was an amazing success as more than one million trees were planted.

In 1970. President Nixon proclaimed the last Friday of April as National Arbor Day, but all 50 states celebrate an Arbor Day. Arbor Day is now celebrated in other countries, such as Australia, Japan, Israel, Korea, Yugoslavia, Iceland and India on various dates and under various names. For homeowners, Arbor Day is an opportunity to take stock of the trees on your property, and plan for the future. Inspect your trees. Make note of broken branches, evidence of disease, or insect infestation. Think about how planting new trees might improve the look of your property or provide wind or heat protection. Consider joining Arbor Day events in your community.


