#### <u>Flag Day, June 14</u>

Flag Day commemorates the day the Second Continental Congress adopted the official flag of United States of America in 1777. The American Flag

was first carried into battle on September 11, 1777 at the Battle of the Brandywine. The American Flag was first saluted by foreign naval vessels on February 14, 1778 when the Ranger, bearing the Stars and Stripes, under the command of Captain John Paul Jones, arrived in a French port. The flag first flew over a foreign territory in early 1778 at Nassau, in the Bahamas when Americans captured a British fort there.

Happy Birthday

It was not until June 14, 1889, that George Bolch, the principal of a free kindergarten for the poor in New York City held patriotic ceremonies to observe the anniversary of Flag Day. This caught the attention of the State Department of Education which arranged to have the day permanently observed. In 1897, the governor ordered the displaying of the flag over all public buildings in the State, the first official recognition of the day outside of schools.

On May 7, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first state to designate June 14 Flag Day as a legal holiday. New York statutes designate the second Sunday in June as Flag Day, a state holiday.

Both President Wilson, in 1916, and President Coolidge, in 1927, issued proclamations asking for June 14<sup>th</sup> to be observed as the National Flag Day. Finally on August 3, 1949, Congress approved the national observance of Flag Day and President Harry Truman signed it into law.
