#### Independence Day

Independence Day of the United States, also referred to as the Fourth of July or July Fourth, is a federal holiday commemorating the formal adoption of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776, by the Continental Congress declaring the thirteen American colonies regarded themselves to be a new nation, the United States of America, and no longer a part of the British Empire. The wording of the resolution of independence was actually approved on July 2, 1776, but the formal Declaration of Independence document was read and approved on July 4th. By August 2, 1776 the three delegates of each of the thirteen colonies had signed the Declaration.

The U.S. Congress made Independence Day an unpaid Federal holiday in 1870 for Federal employees, but it was not until 1938 that Congress changed Independence Day to a paid federal holiday. By coincidence the only two signers to later become president, John Adams in Massachusetts and Thomas Jefferson in Virginia died on July 4, 1826 the fiftieth anniversary of the Declaration of Independence. Another founding father who later became President, James Monroe died on July 4, 1831. He became the third president in a row to die on July 4. Calvin Coolidge, the 30th President was born on July 4, 1872.

## John McGlothlin Little Sir **Volunteerism, part II**

Last month, I highlighted the importance of volunteers to SIR and acknowledged our many volunteers for making SIR what it is today. For

July, I want to mention other opportunities.

As I read through our directory, I see a wealth of experience both individually and collectively. There are many opportunities to share this experience and help others, or to spend time doing something you've always wanted to do. Some examples:

- Some SIRs look back on careers as educators and use their experiences to support youth and the community by promoting recreation, tutoring, assisting teachers (a great opportunity to work at a level, you wanted to teach and never did). One of our SIRs recently assisted San Bruno Community Foundation's selection of scholarship recipients. Also consider Project Read.
- If your career was in public safety, you enjoy helping people. An example of putting this experience to work is at our airport where volunteers at the USO and Travelers Aid greet visitors and help them deal with sometimes daunting directions.
- Many organizations that work with the disadvantaged need help, especially with food distribution. Second Harvest has programs in most communities.
- We all want government to be more effective and responsive. Consider boards and committees where your experience will help. Don't worry if you don't have years of background; often newcomers ask questions that more "experienced" hands rule out with good results.

In short, there are opportunities to fit every interest. Of course, **SIR always needs you!**


