Labor Day

Labor Day, the first Monday in September, was a creation of the labor movement in the

United States and is dedicated to recognizing the social and economic achievements of American workers. It constitutes an annual tribute to the contributions that workers have made to the strength, prosperity and well-being of our country. The first Monday of September was selected as it was about half way between Memorial Day and Thanksgiving.

The first local parade by the Central Labor Union of New York began on September 5, 1882, followed by municipal ordinances in several cities in 1885 and 1886. The first state to actually make Labor Day a holiday was Oregon on February 21, 1887. By 1894, 30 states had made the day a holiday. On June 28, 1894, Congress passed an act making the first Monday in September a legal holiday in all the States, as well as, the District of Columbia and the territories. More than 80 countries recognize the work of their laborers, many celebrate on May 1. The original Labor Day celebrations consisted of street parades displaying the contributions of laborers in various industries, with union leaders and politicians giving speeches on labor-related topics. It has now become to also represent the end of the summer season with picnics and barbecues, the last chance for vacations, the beginning of NCAA college football season, and usually followed later in the week, by the beginning of the NFL season.
