


Walk for Health - Ken Reed - Chair

Cruising Portugal's River of Gold

Uniworld offers a change to the usual Douro River Cruise (up and down the river). Starting with 3 days in Madrid, bus to Portugal via Salamanca, sailing to the mouth of the Douro (Porto), and bus to Lisbon via Nazzare and Obidos.

Madrid is impressive. A month would only scratch the surface. Palaces, Museums, Flamenco, and History. The journey to the border and boat passes the Valley of the

Fallen (Civil War memorial), Avila, and 900 Year-old Salamanca University.

The Queen Isabel boarded travelers at the border and sailed through miles terraced vineyards producing grapes for Port wine. Stops at historical towns and. naturally, wineries. Contrasts of old and new; wineries still crushing grapes using human feet, others using machines with hundreds of metal feet (both superb wines). As the Douro flows seaward, the climate cools and grapes are made into light and fruity Vhino Verde white wines. More wineries to visit and sample. Guimaraes is a nice side trip; a key city in Portugal's history and independence.

After 7 days, Porto (2nd largest city) beckons, docking next to the Port Lodges (aging cellars). More tasting opportunities! Porto is a beautiful city with a bridge that looks like an Eifel Tower on its side.


