Why We Changed Our Location. Picking up from February's Foghorn. After canceling our February lunch, March lunch plans were in flux. Our first alternative was to try to work something out with California Catering (CC). They had required that a minimum of 50 lunches be paid for, no matter how many SIRs attended. In January, SIR had only 27 at the lunch and so SIR had to pay for the unserved 23 lunches. Obviously, this could not continue.

Caterers are feeling the effects of COVID and inflation, paying higher wages and more for food. California Catering would not change the 50-attendee requirement. We could not afford to continue paying for the unserved lunches. We therefore needed to find another location.

The Board (BEC) asked Bob Golton to look at alternate locations and discuss prices while considering whether the locations would provide lunches of the quality our members expect. Based on Bob's research, the Board decided to locate the March 2nd lunch at the **Basque Cultural Center** (**BCC**) in South San Francisco. BCC provides excellent lunches. Bob and Rich Soward met with the Center's management and arranged for our March Luncheon. After considering menus and prices, your Board decided on two courses for \$30.00; Salad and Entrée (*Note: The EMAIL on February 17 erred by mentioning a Soup Course-Little SIR's Sr. Moment*).
