

Aspiring Tony Bennett... Bob Dylan added a string of West Coast dates to his tour in support of his latest release, "Rough and Rowdy Ways," including three nights at the historic Fox Theater in Oakland.

Having wrapped up his first run of concerts since the pandemic began, Dylan plans to kick off the second leg of his tour in Spokane, Wash., over Memorial Day weekend on May 28 - just four days after he turns 81 - and hit a handful of cities along Interstate 5 before winding up in San Diego on June 18.

His stop in Oakland is set for June 9-11, after a concert in Redding on June 7.

Tickets for the concerts go on sale to the public at 10 a.m. Friday, April 22, on Dylan's **website**.
