Sometimes the best (for the Scammer) scams are the old-school ones. One SIR recently received an inquiry from (supposedly) another SIR asking whether they used Amazon/ Sounds simple, yes, and a polite yes resulted in a request to buy some Amazon cards to help the requester get through his problems sending a gift with his Card, buy an e-card and get back to me, so I can help him. By now there was a strong odor of a rat! This Scam has several variations but once the scammer gets the codes you provide them, they are off to the races with your money.

Feeling bad you didn't jump on the Cryptocurrency bandwagon. Don't! You could have snapped up BITCOIN when it was at \$67,700 in November. Today, your "coin" would be worth \$18,946. Who know where it is going next? The Cryptocurrency Company CoinBase is laying off 20% of their workforce despite investment articles just a few months ago that Cryptocurrency was becoming much more popular. Who knows, BITCOIN could be at \$75,000 in a few months but.... Message here, REALLY, REALLY, understand what you are investing in!

Finally, investing during this "perfect storm". Did you know, you can get 9.62% from Series I Savings Bonds from now through October. After October, the rates are reset and may go up, or down. Treasury Bonds are exempt from State and Local income tax.

Compare this with your bank. S&L or Credit Union; some are adjusting upward and others (i.e., Chase) are not.

Wine Tasting

Call Bob Fox for info (415-753-2630). What to watch for; 2020 vintage wines.

As you cannot forget, 2020 was the year of many great fires. These occurred before, during and after the 2020 grape harvests. In 2020 many white wine grapes were harvested before the fires spread and smoke taint affected grapes. For white wines made from Chardonnay grapes, some vineyards were affected. The real damage occurred with the red wine grapes were crushed. Red grapes get their color from the grape skins. Many grapes were affected by "smoke taint". Some brands you usually purchase are affected by the difficult harvest and you may not be able to purchase their 2020 Cabernet Sauvignon, Zinfandel or Pinot Noir wines.

So, what if you do see a 2020 red wine? No reputable winery wants to market wines that taste or smell bad; some harvested as early as possible, some blended in grapes from areas not affected by smoke, some

reduced skin contact, some centrifuged the crushed juice to separate any taint, etc. Advice. Taste a bottle and if you like it, buy! Caution from dealing with the fire's effects may result in lighter, fruitier wines with less alcohol; this isn't bad! Meanwhile 2021 was much less challenging and I think wineries continued to err on the side of harvesting a little early, producing more fruit and less alcohol.
