<u>Richard Soward Reports-Presidio Tunnel Tops.</u> George Suter led another interesting and fun walk, a well-attended gathering at the Presidio Tunnel Tops Walk July 29th. There was excellent parking next to the new Presidio Visitor's Center, the old Army Brig (jail) (in itself worth a visit with historical artifacts and great local history books). All were_happy with the pace as we strolled to the truly magnificent park, well organized and easy to get around.

Presidio Tunnel Tops is America's newest national park space, free and accessible to all! We started at the <u>Presidio Visitor Center</u> and grabbed a Discovery Guide. Also check out the <u>interactive map</u>. After a <u>successful opening weekend</u> in July, visitors have been enjoying <u>special events</u>, <u>artwork</u>, and <u>food</u> at Tunnel Tops.

Much to discover across 14 acres, from stunning views to the <u>Outpost play area</u>. The park was built by the community, for the community, and that spirit lives on through youth programs at the refreshed <u>Crissy Field Center</u>. Walkers were impressed with the landscaping that utilizes indigenous foliage. The walks are very wide and there is easy access to the entire area for handicap with few stairs and other ways not to use them.

Views of downtown, west past the Golden Gate Bridge and the Marin Headlands can be magnificent. Sites of artillery battery placements were easily viewed and many of us visited the Koran War memorial near the end of our walk. San Francisco is known as being the place where things were done right ... and this park is one that demonstrates that "know how." Participants graded this experience an A+.
