

Jerry Blumenthal. Jerry's still on the. Injured list, so here is a "filler" courtesy of the Police Credit Union's Newsletter: the difference between a "fraud" and a "scam." A "fraud" involves someone gaining access to your account and making a purchase, payment, or transfer without your permission. A "scam" is a transaction you were tricked into authorizing (for example you clicked the OK button or gave your credit card information), where you never received the goods or services. Neither situation is good, however it is much easier to recover if you never authorized the transaction than if you were tricked into authorizing or giving your card number. In either case, contact your financial institution as quickly as possible. They may suggest a way to recover from a scam too. (*Editor*).
