Honoring SIR Dave Nigel

SIR David Nigel is the 2020 Recipient of San Bruno's Extraordinary Service Award recognizing and honoring many contributions. Dave was nominated by the San Bruno's Rotary and Lions Clubs recognizing Extraordinary Service. Due to COVID-19, the City Council could not approve this award until 2022.

Dave has served his community as a teacher in both San Bruno and Burlingame for over 30 years. He represented the education community for over 50 years through the Schoolmaster's Club, receiving their Hills Distinguished Service Award, and serving as President.

One of Dave's contributions includes raising thousands of Dollars for scholarships for park and recreation students.

Dave was appointed to San Bruno's Parks and Recreation Commission in 1970. Over 52 years, Dave worked and advocated for facility development, maintenance, and improvement.

Dave represented San Bruno in the California Association of Parks and Recreation Commissioners, serving as President, was inducted into their Hall of Fame and is an Honorary Life Member.

In 2016, Dave was honored by the National Parks and Recreation Association with the Robert M. Artz Award for outstanding efforts to forward public parks and recreation. Dave was inducted in the Northern California Jewish Sports Hall of Fame in 2015.
