"An Exceptional SIR", Dennis Meixner and his twin Thomas were born in Del Paso Heights. When Dennis was five his family moved to San Francisco. Dennis graduated from Balboa High School, not sure what he wanted to do, Dennis enrolled in summer school at City College, taking Criminology Classes; a decision setting him on his career path. He became a Lieutenant in the Campus Police, and a Cadet with the SFPD, while completing his AA in Criminology.

In 1970 he entered the Police Academy. After receiving his draft notice. Dennis was able to get a deferment to complete his probationary period with the Police Department. He entered the US Army in 1971 and completed Basic Training at Fort Ord and was assigned to the 54th MP Company at Fort Ord. In July 1972, he received orders to Viet Nam. Upon arriving it was discovered he was a draftee and not supposed to be sent to Viet Nam. Reassigned to the 110th MP Company, at Camp Ames, Dennis served a year in Korea as the Company Legal Clerk.

Upon discharge, he returned to the SFPD where he completed 33 years of service and retired in 2003. While with the Department, he was promoted to Sergeant. Assignments, as a Patrolman, included Park Station, Central Station, and Psychiatric Liaison. Dennis was also a member of the Specialist Team, training alongside the SWAT Team. As Sergeant, assignments included Richmond Station, Park Station, and Potrero Station, finishing his career at Ingleside Station. He also taught Report Writing for 5 years at the Police Academy, while working nights at the district stations. He also worked with City College's Police to get their officers certified through POST in report writing. Closing out his carrier Dennis returned to college and received his BA in Criminal Justice in 2002 from SF State.

During his career, he received one Gold and four Silver Medals of Valor. In SFPD sports, he was a member of the undefeated Ingleside Softball Team and participated in the California Police Summer Games in Crew and Golf. In Crew, he received a Gold Medal in Pairs, and a Silver Medal in four-man with coxswain, as well as Bronze Medals. In Golf, he received a Gold Medal in the Police Summer Games in Boise. Upon retirement Dennis became a Licensed Tax Preparer, working for H&R Block for 21 years.

While taking golf lessons, through Skyline College, Dennis met a SIR who invited him to a luncheon. In May 2004, Dennis joined Branch 4. In 2015, he won the SIR State Golf Championship, 4th Flight. For one year he was Assistant Treasurer. He enjoys the monthly luncheons and hearing the different speakers. Dennis has brought in several members and is always trying to recruit new members. Sir Ford Long gave Dennis a wood lathe and started a new chapter in Dennis' life; woodworking. Dennis has taken classes and enjoys making things for family and friends.

Dennis has three children, Kevin, Daniel and Lori first living in So San Francisco and then Petaluma where he coached Little League and Senior League Baseball. Dennis and met his wife Donna, in SFPD. when they were both Sergeants and Donna ultimately retired as a Captain. Both enjoy travelling, mainly on cruises, visiting the Caribbean, Mexico, Ireland, the Mediterranean, and the South Pacific. Last year they enjoyed a Cruise on the Mississippi. Next is a cruise on the Great Lakes. Dennis has six grandchildren ages 4 to 19.

Geritol For October. Soquel Vineyards, Trinity Rosso. This red blend of Zinfandel and some Italian-origin varieties is produced by Bargetto Winery, located in Soquel. Bargetto has been in business since the early 30's and had the pick of some nice pre-prohibition vineyards until the Santa Cruz area was (re) discovered in the late 60's and 70's. Most red wine coming to market in the 30's were blends. The winemaker wanted something that tasted good, usually labeling the wine as "burgundy", "claret", "chianti", or even "barbarone" (no such thing as a barbarone grape).
