"An Exceptional SIR", Mike Chapman, submitted by David Nigel. Mike joined Branch 4 in January of 2024. He grew up in San Francisco's outer Sunset with his younger sister and brother, spending time at the Zoo, Playland, DeYoung Museum and the Academy of Sciences, studying music at the Conservatory as well as ice skating. Education included St. Gabriel's, Riordan High and a degree in Fire Science with electives in aeronautics and criminology.

In 1974, Mike joined the SFFD where he worked for thirty-two years, retiring in 2006. Challenging experiences included the Folsom fire in 1982, dubbed the 'Largest fire since 1906" and the 1989 earthquake. Mike worked on many campaigns for the Fire Department and participated in the Firefighter's Toy program for eight years, including three years as Program Chairman. Mike worked in The City at various fire houses all over town, the longest at E29. Calls were in the Mission, South of Market, and Potrero Hill as well as city-wide. After twenty-one years he was assigned to House E29, 16th Street and Vermont later moving to SFFD's, International Airport Division, serving 11 years during the Master Plan expansion; first on the rescue squad, later maintaining rescue boats and teaching water rescues involving plane crashes as well as USAR participation.

Mike and Janis live in San Bruno and have traveled all over the US. Hobbies involve land, sea, and air interests and Mike is sometimes referred to as a "Gear head" because of his interest in machinery. He supports veterans' groups, air museums, boating organizations, old cars and many volunteer organizations including, National Alopecia Areata Foundation, , Eczema Foundation, Propeller Club Port of the Golden Gate supporting WWII vessels SS Jeremiah O'Brien, and SS Red Oak Victory as well as Cal Maritime scholarships. Mike also likes to cook.

Mike enjoys SIR lunches and the camaraderie including presentations and has been one of our luncheon speakers presenting an interesting talk on the history of fire fighter helmets.
